## **BOARD HIGHLIGHTS**

### **Employment**

The resignation of Superintendent, Lauren Sheldrake was approved, with appreciation for Mrs. Sheldrake's service to Sargent. Also accepted was a letter of resignation from Head Volleyball Coach, Lisa Crowder, with appreciation. A notice of intent to retire from Elementary Teacher, Mrs. RosaLee Berry was approved. A contract was approved for Elementary Principal, Laura Kelso for the 2011-12 school year; employment of cafeteria employee, Shelley Vanderpool, substitute teacher, Charles Losee and extra duty pay agreements for coaching positions were also approved.

### **Requisitions**

Requisitions were approved for purchase of computer equipment to Apple.com- \$9,155, books from Everbind- \$2,404.55, insulation work on district houses to Comfort Zone Insulation - \$4,990 and Colorado FBLA for State Leadership Conference registrations - \$4,300.

### **Board Resolutions**

The board approved three budget resolutions as follows: 2010/11 Supplemental Budget Appropriation Resolution, adding \$97,983 to the appropriation; Resolution authorizing use of a portion of the beginning fund balance, \$20,148 and 2010/11 Supplemental Budget Appropriation Resolution, in the amount of \$139,808 pertaining to Education Jobs and ARRA Funding.

### **Policy Revisions**

The board reviewed and approved policies containing revisions recommended by the Colorado Association of School Boards. Revisions align policies with current law and requirements.

### **Declaration of Fiscal Exigency**

The board took action to declare a fiscal exigency. Though decisions pertaining to budget reductions have not been made, districts have been advised to declare a fiscal exigency at this time. This will provide timely notice in the event of a reduction of staff.

### **Other Items**

Financial reports for February, including the cash flow report were reviewed and approved and minutes of the previous meeting were approved. Two out-of-district student enrollment requests and a student work study application were approved. Also approved was a \$500 donation to Children's Voices.

### **Discussion Items**


The board discussed a date to reschedule their planned work session; it will take place on April 14<sup>th</sup>. Also discussed was the 2011-12 calendar and questions for a budget survey that will be sent out.

### **Next Meeting:**

The next regular meeting of the board will be April 25, 2011 at 7:00 p.m. In addition, a work session will be held on April 14 for budget planning and discussion.

## Sargent School District Teacher of the Year

Mrs. Kristen Stambaugh was selected as the teacher of the year for the 2010-2011 school year. Mrs. Stambaugh has been teaching 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> grade Science for the last three years. She has rewritten a comprehensive standard's based science curriculum which vertically aligns with the grade levels above and below her. Part of her curriculum includes having every 5<sup>th</sup> grade student produce a science fair project. The countless hours of hard work she spent on these projects has paid off as Sargent Elementary School has won the Outstanding Small School award for the last two years in a row under her direction.

Mrs. Stambaugh is also a literacy specialist and is able to help her students understand the process of accessing expository text and writing scientifically. She uses new and innovative methods to teach science concepts in her classes. Her students are always engaged in hands-on experiments or activities whether it is as a small group, partners or as an individual.

Mrs. Stambaugh is a graduate of ASC and taught in Las Animas, Colorado Springs and Alamosa before coming to Sargent Elementary School in 2009.
