REQUIREMENTS FOR GRADUATION:

Starting with the graduating class of 2007 and beyond, Sargent High School shall require a minimum of 27 credits for graduation. The following must be included in the 27 credits.

English	4 credits	Second Language	2 credits

Grading Scale:

A = 100-90%

B = 89-80%

C = 79-70%

D = 69-60%

F = 59-50%

Weighted Grades:

In an effort to encourage high school students to take academically challenging classes and also to encourage them to enroll in a full schedule of classes, the following weighting will be applied to grades in advanced classes that meet the criteria below.

Criteria for Weighted Grade Status

1. All advanced placement (A.P.) courses at the high school will have weighted grade status.
2. Students must be enrolled in five or more graded classes per semester in order to receive weighted grades.

The point value of A.P. classes will be based on a 5.0 scale. Weighted grading will begin with the 2010-2011 school year with the Class of 2012.

Class rankings shall be determined on a four-point scale. All classes for which credit is given shall be used in the computation.

Class rank shall be determined by assigning the highest grade point average the rank of number one, the second highest the rank of number two, etc. In cases where more than one student has the same numeral average, all students with that average shall be given the same rank. The next highest grade point average shall assume the next rank position reflecting the number of students having a higher rank. [Example: 3 students at 4.0; next ranked student would rank 4th – not 2nd]. Students shall be ranked at the end of the second semester of the senior year. Only those approved high school credits earned in grades 7 through 12 shall be used in the ranking.

Grade point averages to determine the valedictorian and salutatorian shall be carried out to four decimal places and rounded back to three decimal places. [Example: 3.9864—round to 3.986; 3.9865 round to 3.987] When there is a tie based on grade point averages the highest ACT score will be used to determine the valedictorian selection. The second highest ranking student according to the above guidelines will be designated as salutatorian.

Honor Rolls:

Sargent Jr/Sr High School has two academic lists to honor those students who show superior progress in their academic studies. The **Principal's List** is for those students who have a **GPA of 3.5-3.99**; the **Superintendent's List** is for those students who have a **GPA of 4.0**.

STUDENT ATTENDANCE:

At 8:00 am, all outside doors will be locked down with the exception of the front entrance. After 8:00am, please enter through the main office doors. Please contact the office by 8:30am (by email or phone) to report your child's absence.

The following regulations shall apply to secondary students:

Excused Absences:

The following shall be considered excused absences:

1. A student who is temporarily ill or injured or whose absence is approved by the administrator of the school of attendance on a prearranged basis. Prearranged absences shall be approved for appointments or circumstances of a *serious nature only* which cannot be taken care of outside of school hours.
2. A student who is absent for an extended period (4 days) due to physical, mental or emotional disability will be contacted by the school.
3. A student who is attending any school-sponsored activity or activities of an educational nature with prearranged approval by the administration.
4. A student who is attending a funeral or other related activities in the bereavement process.
5. A student who is suspended or expelled

Unexcused Absences:

An unexcused absence is defined as an absence that is not covered by one of the foregoing exceptions. Each unexcused absence shall be entered on the student's attendance record. The parents or guardians of any student being assigned an unexcused absence shall be notified orally or in writing by the district.

In accordance with law, the district may impose appropriate penalties that relate directly to classes missed while unexcused. Penalties may include a warning, school detention or in-school suspension at the discretion of the building principal. Academic penalties, out-of-school suspensions or expulsion shall not be imposed for any unexcused absences.

CONSEQUENCES FOR UNEXCUSED ABSENCES:

2 Unexcused absences: warning, school to contact parents

3 and 4 unexcused absences: after school detention, 1 hour

5 unexcused absences: in school suspension

Every following unexcused absence: in school suspension for each day missed

Tardies:

1. Tardiness is defined as the appearance of a student without a proper excuse after the scheduled time that a class begins. Students will be considered tardy during the first 1/3 of the class period and absent after 1/3 of the period has passed.

2. Students will be allowed three tardies per nine weeks. Three tardies in the same class during a nine-week grading period will count as one unexcused absence. On the third tardy, students will be notified that an additional tardy may result in a suspension from school for up to three days. Parents or guardians will be notified of all suspensions regarding tardiness. In an unavoidable situation, a student detained by another teacher or administrator will not be considered tardy, provided that the teacher or administrator gives the student a pass to enter his next class. Teachers will honor passes presented in accordance with this policy.

Consequences for excessive tardies are as follows:

3 and 4 tardies: 30 minutes of after school detention and call to parents

5 tardies: after school detention, 1 hour and meeting with parents

After 5 tardies: move to unexcused absence rubric at level 2

CHECKING INTO SCHOOL AFTER AN ABSENCE:

When a student is absent on his/her return to school, the student must report to the office prior to 8:00am with a note written in ink stating the date of the absence, the reason for the absence and signed by a parent or guardian. If only a portion of the day was missed, give the time segment. The office must receive the written confirmation the **first day** following the absence in order for it to be considered an excused absence. **Make-up work** will be permitted for absences at the initiation of the student. It is the responsibility of the student to make arrangements with teachers for work missed. One day to make up work will be allowed for each day that is missed.

Any absence other than illness or bereavement must be prearranged. Students should pick up a **prearranged absence form** in the office, secure the signature of each classroom teacher and a parent signature and return it to the office for verification by the principal. In the cases of appointments (doctor, dentist, court date, etc.), a **prearranged absence** should be completed prior to the appointment and **the student must bring back a note from the doctor or court official upon return.** The school reserves the right to call a parent to confirm any signature whose validity appears in question. The school also reserves the right to require medical verification.

STUDENT CONDUCT:

STUDENT DRESS CODE:

An individual's grooming and the way he/she dresses have a direct bearing on how others react to that individual and therefore affect one's behavior. If a style is disruptive to the educational process or constitutes a threat to the safety and/or health of the student or others, or how others react to the student, the offending clothing will not be permitted in school. Examples of inappropriate apparel

include, but are not limited to clothing or accessories that express obscene language, tobacco, alcohol and drug symbols, satanic graphics, gang affiliation; chains or spikes; clothing which exposes the body inappropriately which includes skimpy, see-through, fish-net tops, tube tops, spaghetti strap tops, backless clothing, muscle shirts or athletic mesh shirts/half shirts, exposing of undergarments; short shorts, bicycle-type shorts; hats, caps, headbands, bandanas, or other head coverings in the building shredded or ripped clothing, and unbuckled or hanging overall straps, or gang related apparel; any tight, low-cut clothing, "sagging" clothing that bare or expose traditionally private parts of the body including, butnot limited to, the stomach, back, buttocks, and breasts.

Inappropriate apparel must be changed. Wearing a jacket over the clothing is not a substitute. Students will be given clothing to wear in place of the inappropriate items.

In cases of questionable dress, the administration will decide what is appropriate.

HALL PASSES:

Students learn when they are in the classroom; therefore hall passes will be kept to a **minimum** by teachers. If hall passes are abused, teachers and/or the principal will limit or revoke pass privileges.

TELEPHONE USE:

Students are to use the office phone **only for emergencies**. Cell phones are not to be on during school hours except during lunch. Messages for students will be taken and given to the students by the office.

ELECTRONIC DEVICES:

These items are not to be displayed or used on campus during or in between classes. The use of cell phones and other electronic devices will be allowed during the lunch period outside of the school building only (There is to be no use of electronic devices while in the cafeteria). Lunch time use of electronic devices is a privilege and may be revoked if abused. If an electronic device is visible or in use during restricted times, it may be confiscated and will be returned at the end of the week. Please keep cell phones, pagers, ipods, and CD players in your purse, backpack, or locker. Cell phones are to be turned **OFF** at all times. Violation of this policy will result in appropriate disciplinary measures to be assessed.

CHECKING OUT OF SCHOOL:

Students must have permission from their parents to leave school. Sign name in the logbook in the office, indicate destination, purpose and the time leaving. Then get authorization to leave the building from the secretary, counselor or principal.

Those who fail to check out in the proper manner will have an unverified absence recorded. This will be considered an unexcused absence and disciplinary action will be taken.

CLOSED CAMPUS:

Sargent secondary school has established a **closed campus** policy. This means that no student is permitted to leave the school premises to eat lunch. Students will not be allowed to check out of school for the sole purpose of eating out at the local communities. The principal reserves the right to grant special requests at his/her discretion. Parents may not excuse their student to leave the building for lunch. If such an occasion occurs, this will be considered an unexcused absence. No student should EVER be in the elementary gym unless they are with a coach or teacher.

PARKING:

On campus parking is a privilege not a right. All student vehicles must be registered with the office. All drivers must have a valid driver's license and proof of insurance. Students will park only in the student parking lot on the west side of County Road 2E. Students driving on or around the campus must do so in a safe and prudent manner in order to maintain a safe environment for other students. Students parked in the parking lot North of the high school, in the bus loop, preschool parking lot, high school visitor parking or in front of the high school during school hours will receive detention hall.

No student will be allowed to be in the student parking area during the regular academic day except:

- If a student is leaving to a scheduled work-study program
- For a scheduled college class
- For a scheduled appointment
- If a student has authorization by the principal

FOOD AND DRINKS:

Students are expected to help keep the building clean. Please ALWAYS place your trash in trash cans.

TOBACCO, DRUGS, AND ALCOHOL:

Use, possession, distribution and/or selling of tobacco, illegal drugs or alcohol **ON** or **OFF** school property to another Sargent student will not be tolerated and is in violation of the law. Violation of this policy will result in appropriate disciplinary measures to be assessed. These measures may include suspension and/or expulsion and notification of law enforcement officials. It is best to keep our campus tobacco, drug, and alcohol free!

PUBLIC DISPLAY OF AFFECTION:

Students are permitted to hold hands but no other display of affection will be allowed. Students displaying affection will be referred to the principal. If students continue to display inappropriate behavior, the parent(s)/guardian(s) will be contacted and a meeting will be scheduled between the

students, parent(s)/guardian(s), and administrator. If behavior does not change, then the act will be considered defiance and the students will be suspended.

SEXUAL HARASSMENT:

Sexual harassment includes but is not limited to unwelcome sexual advances, requests for sexual favors, sex-oriented verbal “kidding”, repeated remarks to a person with touching, patting, pinching, or repeated brushing against another’s body. It is a violation of policy for any student or member of the district staff to harass another student or staff member through conduct or communications of a sexual nature. If you feel that you have been a victim of sexual harassment, please see the counselor or principal regarding appropriate reporting procedures.

STAFF PROTECTION:

Students who assault and/or harass teachers or other school employees are in violation of the Criminal Code of the State of Colorado and will be suspended or expelled and prosecuted to the fullest extent of the law. This also applies to substitute teachers as well. Substitute teachers are guest teachers in our building. **NOTE:** Guest teachers deserve the same respect as all other adults in the building. Students who are disrespectful to our guest teachers will be sent to the office with a referral and if the student is found guilty of lack of cooperation, defiance, insubordination, or disruptive behavior, he/she will receive appropriate discipline.

BEHAVIOR AND DISCIPLINE MATRIX:

NOTES: There will be a ZERO TOLERANCE for threats and harassment. The incident will be investigated and if found to be valid will be reported to the student's parents/guardians and to the law enforcement authorities.

Any other violations not listed above will be handled thorough administrative investigations and consequences will be determined by the administration.

Any ten (10) day out of school infraction could lead to an expulsion hearing. The Principal can suspend a student from school a maximum of ten (10) days. An infraction that warrants an expulsion hearing requires the Principal to recommend expulsion to the Superintendent of Schools. The Superintendent can extend the suspension beyond the original 10 days to include the date for an expulsion hearing.

EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITY RULES

WEEKLY ELIGIBILITY:

To be eligible to participate in extracurricular activities, a student must be passing 3.0 Carnegie units and have acceptable citizenship status. The student is ineligible if:

1. Has more than **one** failing grade per week
2. Has a failing grade **two weeks in a row** in the same class.

Grades will be checked Monday at noon and an eligibility list will be given to teachers and coaches by 3:30pm on that Monday. The eligibility period runs from Monday through Monday night for the designated week or period, one-week or longer. Students who are ineligible cannot participate in an event until that are reassessed for the new period which begins on the following Monday. Students receiving "Incomplete" are eligible to compete when the "I" is converted to a passing grade prior to the competition (and is passing 3.0 carnegie units). Period exceptions: At the end of the nine weeks the eligibility period is 2 weeks, and Thanksgiving week stays the same as the previous week. At the beginning of each nine weeks the eligibility period is 2 weeks based on the final grades for the previous nine weeks.

Ineligible student will not be allowed to miss class for any activity held during the school day. Ineligible players cannot travel with the team nor can they sit with the team during competition. Adherence to this policy is the responsibility of the team coach/sponsor.

Students who are not eligible cannot participate in an event until grades are reassessed for the new period, which begins the following Monday.

Ineligible students will not be allowed to miss class for any activity held during the school day. Ineligible students will be allowed to practice with the team, but will not be allowed to travel with the team or sit on the team bench. Ineligible students will not participate in any other school functions such as Knowledge Bowl, Spelling Bee, or other competitions or school sponsored activities.

If a student misses school the day of an extracurricular activity, he/she will not be allowed to participate in the activity. Exceptions will only be allowed through parental contact and prior approval from the principal. A student must attend at least three (3) class periods on the day of the competition in order to compete.

The student will be released only to the parent after the activity. Parents must contact the coach or sponsor after the event to state that their child will be riding home with them. If the student needs to ride home with another parent a phone call must be made 24 hours in advance to the principal or athletic director and a written note must be presented to the coach or sponsor before leaving the

event. Unless this procedure is followed, the coach or sponsor will not release a student and the student will return to the school in the school's transportation.

School sponsored activities include any situation when students are under direct supervision of a coach, teacher, or sponsor and representing Sargent Junior/Senior High School in some capacity, either at school or any school trip. This includes attendance as a spectator at school events. The Sargent High School Administration and the Board of Education will not tolerate behavior, which is detrimental to the welfare, safety and morals of others.

Any unlawful act taking place on school grounds or excursion not only makes the student subject to penalties which the courts may prescribe, but also will result in disciplinary action by the administration. Some examples of unacceptable behavior would include, but are not limited to, use of prohibitive drugs, abusive language, damaging property, and open or persistent defiance of proper authority.

Students who are on overnight trips that break or abuse rules are subject to being sent home at the parents expense or having the parents come pick them up.

WORK STUDY:

Students applying for work-study opportunities must meet the following criteria:

- All work-study programs must be pre-approved by the Counselor, Principal or Superintendent and the Board of Education
- Be a senior currently enrolled in Sargent High School
- Have in place a plan that includes courses needed for graduation
- Have access to a job that provides training opportunities which is not with a parent, unless the student has a waiver from the Board of Education
- Maintain acceptable grades in all classes at school prior to and during work-study
- Have parental permission
- Provide own transportation
- Ability to make work schedule acceptable to the school
- Maintain punctual and regular work and school attendance
- Work opportunity not to exceed half the school day, including transportation time

VISITOR PASSES:

If you would like to visit your child's classroom or teacher's, please make prior arrangements when possible. All visitors in the building during school hours are required to get a pass from the office upon entry to the building. Teachers will not admit visitors to their classroom without a visitor badge. Student guests are discouraged and must have approval from the principal. We will make every attempt not to disrupt instructional time. If you would like to have a conference with your child's teacher please make arrangements to do so during the teachers planning time or either before or after school.
